

Johannes Hiemetsberger

Johannes Hiemetsberger is both the founder and artistic director of Chorus sine nomine (1991) and Company of Music.

As a conductor, he works together with ensembles such as L'Orfeo Baroque Orchestra, Camerata Salzburg, Ensemble Prisma Wien, Wiener Akademie Orchestra, the wind section of the Vienna Symphony Orchestra, the "NDR Chor Hamburg", the "Chor des Bayerischen Rundfunks", Munich, and the Sociedad de Coral de Bilbao. He regularly conducts concerts in the Konzerthaus Vienna, Wiener Musikverein, for Jeunesse, at the Salzburg Festival, styriarte, the International Bruckner Festival Linz, the Ravenna Festival or the Festival dell'Aurora.

Johannes Hiemetsberger teaches choir and ensemble conducting at the University of Music and Performing Arts in Vienna and was the artistic director of the Webern Kammerchor from 2011 to 2016. He teaches various international vocal and choirmaster courses („Europa Cantat“ in Nevers and Barcelona, workshops in the Philippines and Taiwan, among others) and workshops and masterclasses (Finland, Germany, the Philippines, Taiwan, Italy). He founded and conducted several youth choirs (Oberösterreichischer Landesjugendchor 200-2005, Neue Wiener Stimmen 2010-2013). Since 2008, he has been the artistic director of the „Stimmen-Festival Freistadt“ (Upper Austria).

He received his musical education at the Bruckner Conservatory Linz, the Vienna Conservatory (conducting under Georg Mark and Old Music), and the University of Music and Performing Arts, Vienna (Music Teaching; choirmaster course with Johannes Prinz and Herwig Reiter). Johannes Hiemetsberger was awarded the Erwin Ortner Fund Prize as well as the Ferdinand Grossmann Prize.
